Scope of midwifery practice

The midwife is recognised as a responsible and accountable professional who works in partnership with women to give the necessary support, care and advice during pregnancy, labour and the postpartum period, to conduct births on the midwife's own responsibility and to provide care for the newborn and the infant. This care includes preventative measures, the promotion of normal birth, the detection of complications and abnormal situations in mother and infant, the accessing of medical care or other appropriate assistance and the carrying out of emergency measures.

The midwife has an important task in health counselling and education, not only for the woman, but also within the family and the community. This work should involve antenatal education and preparation for parenthood and may extend to women's health, sexual / reproductive health and child care.

A midwife may practise in any setting including the home, community, hospitals, clinics or health units.

Preamble

The Midwives Council of Hong Kong ("the Council") (formerly named as the Midwives Board), established in 1910, is a statutory body for the regulation and registration of the midwifery profession in Hong Kong. The Council has developed the "Handbook for Midwives" and "Core Competencies for Registered Midwives", which serve as directions to assist midwives in the course of their practice in order to maintain professional care and standard as well as decree the competencies of professional midwives.

In addition, the registered midwives should practise in accordance with the "Handbook for Midwives" and "Core Competencies for Registered Midwives". These documents will be subjected to constant review in order to ensure the appropriateness and usefulness to reflect the contemporary role and requirements of practicing as registered midwives in Hong Kong.

In 2018, discussion in the Council about the advanced midwifery practice was made and it was agreed that with the development in midwifery, two levels of midwifery practice, general and advanced midwifery practice, could be established. The Council then started to work out the scope of practice, its domains of work and the core competencies for the advanced practice midwives.

Advanced midwifery practice is the performance of additional acts by registered midwives who had gained added knowledge and skills meeting the criteria as required by the Council in obtaining the recognition of advanced practice midwives.

Recognition of Advanced Practice Midwife

An advanced practice midwife ("APM") is an experienced, autonomous midwife who has acquired proficiency in midwifery practice and attained the post-registration educational preparation and passed the required assessment as stipulated by the Council from time to time; and recognised to practise advanced midwifery. The roles of advanced practice midwives are developed in response to woman's needs and health service requirements at local, national and international levels.

Advanced Midwifery Practice

Advanced Midwifery Practice ("AMP") is to utilize advanced midwifery knowledge and expert skills to provide optimum care and improve clinical outcomes for woman and her babies through higher levels of cognitive capabilities, critical analysis, problem solving and accurate clinical decision making. Eight domains of advanced midwifery practice are identified to explain the work of the advanced practice midwives and to enhance the differentiation of the practice between a registered midwife and that of an advanced practice midwife. The eight domains are: direct midwifery care; consultation and referral; networking and collaboration; clinical education; personal and professional development; leadership and advocacy; quality assurance and improvement; and research and evidence-based practice. The core competencies of the advanced practice midwife are developed according to these eight domains.

Competencies of Advanced Practice Midwife

Competencies are classified according to the following eight domains:

- 1. Direct midwifery care
- 2. Consultation and referral
- 3. Networking and collaboration
- 4. Clinical education
- 5. Personal and professional development
- 6. Leadership and advocacy
- 7. Quality assurance and improvement
- 8. Research and evidence-based practice
